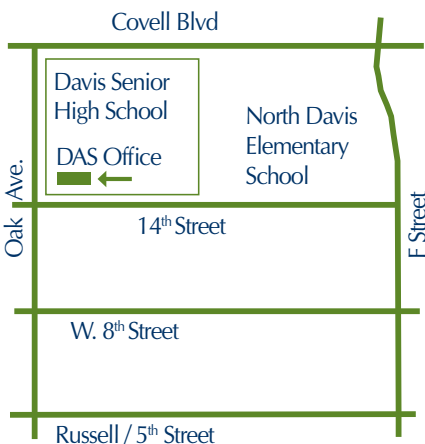

### How do I register for Community Interest Classes?

1. Mail in a check and the completed registration form. (Form available on the back of this booklet, or download it from our website)
2. Stop by our office on the corner of Oak and 14th St. with cash or a check and the completed registration form. (State-funded class registration **MUST** be in person.)

### Do you accept Credit Cards?

No. Cash or check only.

### What is your Refund Policy?

A partial refund will be made upon request within two business days following the first class. The refund fee is \$5 per course plus the prorated cost of the class attended. Special refund restrictions apply to the SAT class. Please be prepared to provide evidence that your check has cleared.

## Important Instructions for Early Registration

Students are strongly encouraged to register for courses before the quarters begin January 4 and March 22. Classes sometimes reach their maximum enrollment prior to the first day of class. Early Winter Registration at the Adult School office is from December 1 through December 17, 8:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Early Spring Registration is from March 1 through March 18. The office is closed on Fridays.

**Admission Requirements:** Persons 18 years of age or older may enroll in adult education classes. If parents are enrolled and attending a fee-based class, high school age students may enroll in the same fee class for personal growth. Concurrent students who need credit for high school graduation must schedule an appointment with their school counselor and the adult education principal.

**Tuition:** For community-interest classes, fees in the form of cash or check are collected at the time of registration. We regret that we cannot register students by phone or accept payment by credit card. If you wish to register by mail, a registration form is included in this brochure and on our website. Please complete and mail with a check made payable to DJUSD. Please do not mail cash. Students who mail registrations will be enrolled in the course in the order received. Adult school cannot be responsible for registrations that are lost in the mail. Students who mail registration forms will be contacted only if the course has filled or has been cancelled.

If students choose to mail in the registration form and fee, they should attend the first class unless they have been contacted by Adult School staff.

Please do not use mail-in registration forms for state-funded courses.

**Textbooks:** Some fee-based classes use textbooks. They may be purchased during office hours at the Adult School office and are not returnable.

**Senior Discount:** Persons 60 years of age or older receive a 10% discount on tuition. Exceptions include computer and sewing class tuitions, all state-funded course tuitions, materials fees, and the cost of books.

**Refunds:** A partial refund will be made upon request within two business days following the first class. The refund fee is \$5 per course plus the prorated cost of the class attended. Special refund restrictions apply to the SAT class. Please be prepared to provide evidence that your check has cleared.

**Class Cancellation:** Any class may be cancelled or shortened if there are not approximately 15 tuition-paying students registered prior to the first class. If a class is cancelled, students who have enrolled will be notified either prior to or at the time of the first class.

**Community Interest Courses** are offered to meet the needs and interests of adult learners in Davis and the surrounding community for a small tuition. At times, students and teachers agree to shorten the length of a class so that it can run with fewer students enrolled. Classes without minimum initial enrollment are subject to cancellation and refund.

**State Funded Courses** are partially funded by the state of California. Students registering for state-funded classes must register in person at the office. Registration is typically open throughout the school year. Tuition is not charged for the following state-funded courses: Adults with Developmental Disabilities, English as a Second Language (ESL), and High School Subjects.
