SENIOR INFORMATION NIGHT

SENIORS APPLYING TO A UC CAMPUS

There will be a workshop on Thursday, September 29th, at 7:00 p.m. in the Instructional Performing Arts Building (IPAB) at DSHS, regarding completing the application for the University of California. This workshop is for students and parents. It is recommended that students apply online at <http://www.ucop.edu/pathways/>. The online application will be available beginning October 1st. The applications may be submitted November 1st – 30th. It is best to apply early. The system can get overloaded at the end of the month. For completing the UC personal statement, there is an online UC personal statement writing tutorial, available at www.ucgateways.org.

SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Scholarship information can be requested from colleges and universities, organizations you belong to, the Internet at www.fastweb.com, www.finaid.org, businesses, foundations, or other sources. It is not recommended that you send money to scholarship search services that advertise or send information to you. DSHS also generates a Scholarship Bulletin every two weeks. DSIS students are eligible for many of the scholarships described. This bulletin will be available soon.

INFORMATION FOR OTHER GRADE LEVELS

PSAT – JUNIORS AND SOPHOMORES

PSAT – The Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test is a preview of the SAT 1 and helps forecast future performance. It is also used to qualify for scholarship competition in the National Merit Scholarship Program. The PSAT will be given Saturday, October 15th in the N and P wings at Davis Senior High School from 8:00 a.m. to approximately 11:00 a.m. Registration will be the week of October 3rd. More details will be in the October newsletter.

JUNIORS AND SENIORS

Following is the SAT/ACT schedule for the fall. For seniors applying to four-year colleges, the tests must be taken by December but preferably by November.

You may register on-line at www.collegeboard.com (for SAT materials), or www.actstudent.org (for ACT materials). The SAT and ACT are accepted by most colleges (UC and CSU will take either one).

Fee Waivers: Students who qualify for free/reduced lunch also qualify for fee waivers for the SAT and ACT. Please let me know if you need this.

SAT PREPARATION WORKSHOP

A workshop stressing test-taking strategies and good use of time will be presented in October and November by Davis Adult School for high school students who are preparing to take the SAT college entrance exam. The SAT college entrance exam tests grammar and usage, reading comprehension of short passages, and content from third year high school math. Instruction will include review of vocabulary and math concepts, when to make an educated guess, and how to pace yourself. The class is offered Thursday evenings 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. Register at the Davis Adult School, the corner of Oak Ave and 14th St. The cost is \$85. CALIFORNIA HIGH SCHOOL PROFICIENCY EXAM (CHSPE)

The CHSPE is an examination which assesses a student's proficiency in the basic reading, writing and mathematics skills taught in the public high schools. If a student passes the examination, the California State Board of Education will award a Certificate of Proficiency, which by state law is equivalent to a high school diploma (although not equivalent to completing all coursework required for regular graduation from high school). The test is being offered this fall, on Saturday, October 15th. The regular registration deadline is September 16th. The cost is \$110. The late Registration deadline is September 30th and costs \$135. The Emergency Registration Date is October 11th and costs \$160.
