



What is School Governance?

Governance refers to how decision making happens in education systems. It refers to the institutions and dynamics through which education systems allocate roles and responsibilities, determine priorities and designs, and carry out education policies and programs.





Guiding Principles...

- 1. Operate with the belief that everyone wants what is best for all students.
- 2. Be data informed and student driven.
- Believe in the value of your perspective and the perspective of others in the process.





Roles and Responsibilities

- 1. Advise the Principal and Staff on:
 - a. Student Needs
 - b. Educational Programs
 - c. School Services
- Help gather input from the school community.
- 2. Encourage participation in school activities.





Site Level Advisories

- School Site Council
- English Learner Advisory Committee (ELAC)
- 3. Climate Committee (Elementary)





School Site Council Responsibilities

- Support with the development of Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)/ School Plan
- Annual process for developing, reviewing and updating
- Updating includes comprehensive review of data and the development of actions necessary to achieve school goals






Example of Annual SPSA Planning Cycle

Months	Activities
December- January	Analyze Student Data and Measure the Effectiveness of Current Strategies
February - March	Identify Goals and Areas for Improvement
April	Define Timelines, Personnel, and Expenditures (Complete Template)
May	Adopt SPSA and Recommend to the Board
August	Implement SPSA
August- November	Monitor Implementation

English Learner Advisory Committee


- Assist in the development of the school wide needs assessment for English Learners (EL)

- 3. Advise the Principal and Staff on the development of site needs of English learners and submit to the School Site Council for consideration of inclusion in the School Plan






